Qwo-Li Driskill is a non-citizen/unenrolled Cherokee Two-Spirit writer, performer, and activist also of African, Irish, Lenape, Lumbee, and Osage ascent. They are the author of *Asegi Stories: Cherokee Queer and Two-Spirit Memory* (University of Arizona), which was a finalist for a Lambda Literary Award in 2017, and *Walking with Ghosts: Poems* (Salt Publishing). S/he is also the co-editor of *Sovereign Erotics: A Collection of Two-Spirit Literature and Queer Indigenous Studies: Critical Interventions in Theory, Politics, and Literature* (University of Arizona). They are an Associate Professor and Director of Graduate Studies in Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies at Oregon State University.
